- \$ 6,704,490 with WBE prime contractors
- \$ 2,231,873 with MBE subcontractors
- \$ 2,184,543 with WBE subcontractors
- \$ 18,593,493 **TOTAL WITH MWBES**

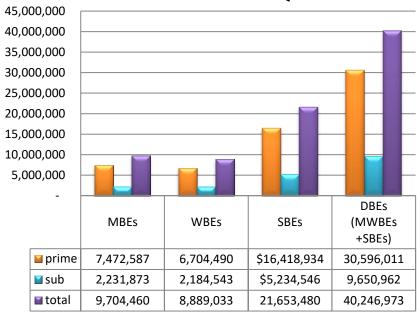

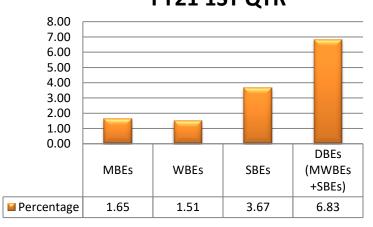

## Metropolitan Government of Nashville & Davidson County EBO and Outreach Update

FY21 - 1st Quarter (July - September 2020)

Important points to note about the EBO Program which launched on July 5, 2019:

2.	<b>846 thousand</b> is the total estimated spend with minority or woman owned businesses;
	a. <b>537 thousand</b> is the total estimated spend with minority owned businesses;

**309 thousand** is the total estimated spend with woman owned businesses;

3. **7%** is the combined goal for minority or woman owned business participation;

1. Metro Government awarded **7** contracts with race and gender conscious goals.

- a. 5% is the average proposed goal for minority owned business participation;
- b. **2%** is the average proposed goal for woman owned business participation.
- 4. Two projects had WBE primes, and one had an SBE prime
  - a. Due to multiple emergency roofing projects decreasing the available subcontracting pool, (there were 4 awarded this quarter) primes for 2 roofing projects needed to utilize good faith efforts
- 5. There have been several department trainings to build familiarity and support for the EBO Program.

  To date, 75 Metro personnel have participated in training sessions to learn how MBE and WBE goals are established, and how they can help to ensure expediency in the procurement process.

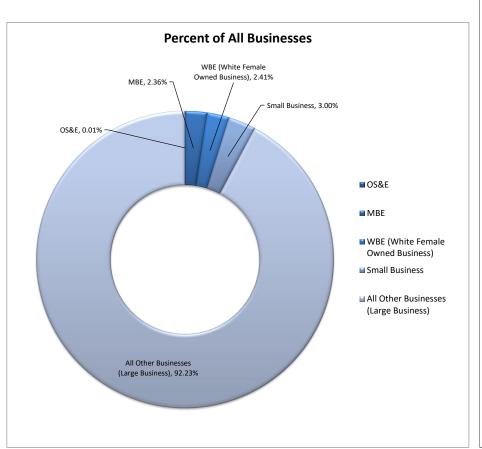

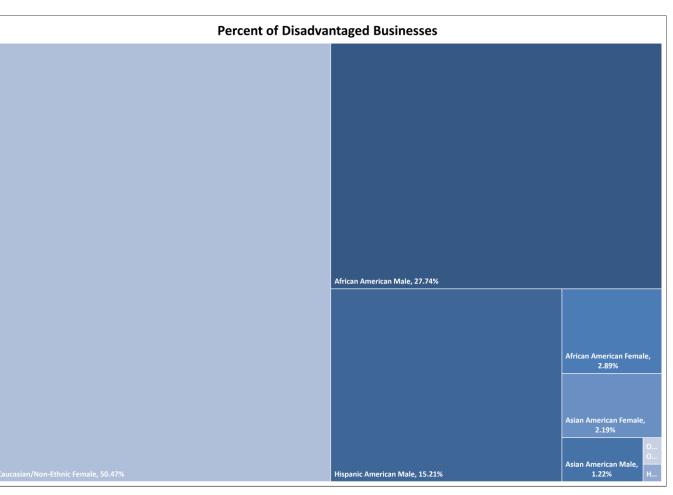

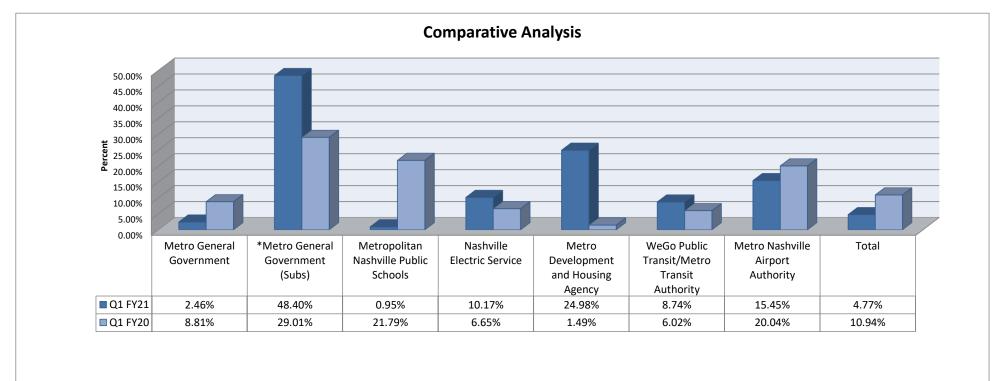
