# WHERE ARE WE NOW? - FY 2018

- \$34 million estimated revenue shortfall
  - \$26 million property tax
  - \$8 million BEP & all other
- \$20.6 million in FY 2018 supplemental appropriations
- Fund balance below 5%
- Partial offset from targeted savings

# LOOKING AHEAD


- No tax increase
- Revenue growth returning to normal (sales & property)
- Decline in other revenue sources (BEP & Hall Income Tax)
- No increase in pension costs
- \$2 million for August & November elections
- Department budgets maintained at current funding



# TOTAL BUDGET GROWTH






# TOTAL PROJECTED REVENUE GROWTH \$87.8 MILLION

- Property Taxes \$15 million
- Local Option Sales Tax \$25 million
- Grants and Contributions \$3.6 million net decrease
- All Other \$51.4 million
  - Contingent upon \$38 million in public property sales & securing on-street parking vendor


#### BUDGETED REVENUE GROWTH BY FISCAL YEAR




# MAJOR CITY/COUNTY FY2018 PROPERTY TAX RATES





# GENERAL FUND SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS




# NET RESOURCES AVAILABLE \$22 MILLION

# WHERE THE MONEY GOES \$ 22 MILLION

- Metro Employees & Pensioners \$10.7 million (GSD/USD)
- Schools \$5 million
- General Hospital-\$11.1 million over FY18 budget of \$35M
- Debt Service \$11.7 million (principal and interest)
- Other Operations (net) \$16.5 million savings\*
  - \* This amount includes departmental targeted savings of \$11.5M

MNPS Debt Service Budget



# METRO EMPLOYEES

# \$8.5 million\*

- One-year pay plan
- Increments for eligible employees (effective increment date)
- 2.5% for open range increases (effective July 1)
- No increase in employee health insurance cost

#### METRO PENSIONERS

# \$2.2 million

 Pensioner health benefit increase primarily due to anticipated increase in number of pensioners

#### HEALTH & HOSPITALS

• \$46.1 million - General Hospital

- \$3.5 million Bordeaux Nursing Home
  - Funds contract with Signature
- \$2 million Knowles Assisted Living Facility
  - Funds contract with Anthem Care

# ADDITIONAL BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

- Metro Facility Openings
  - Smith Springs Community Center
  - Madison Community Center
  - Family Justice Center
- Public Works Improvements
  - Funding for additional services in newly annexed USD areas
- Support for Small Chambers of Commerce
  - \$25,000 each for Black, Hispanic, Latino, & LGBT Chambers

# ADDITIONAL BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS (CONTINUED)

- \$250,000 for Youth Violence Initiatives
- \$400,000 for Coordinated Pre-K Initiative
