Service-Connected Disabilities

Disability compensation is a tax-free monetary benefit paid to Veterans with disabilities resulting from disease or injury incurred or aggravated during military service. Compensation may also be paid for disabilities related (or secondary) to disabilities occurring in service and for disabilities presumed to be related to military service, even though they may arise after service. Examples of categories include:

- Prisoners of war
- Airborne hazards
- Gulf War Veterans
- Open burn pits
- Ionizing radiation
- Toxic embedded fragments
- Agent orange pesticide
- Depleted uranium

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)

DIC is a tax-free benefit paid to eligible survivors of military service members:

- Who died in the line of duty, or
- Whose death resulted from a service-related disability, or
- Who were rated 100% permanently and totally disabled for 10 consecutive years

Re-marriage could affect DIC eligibility. DIC recipients may also qualify for a property tax exemption (a state benefit). ChampVA and Dependents' Educational Assistance are additional benefits.

Home Loans

The VA offers a variety of home loan guaranty programs for active duty service members, Veterans, and National Guard and Reserve members. Programs include:

- Home loans at competitive interest rates, often with no down payment or private mortgage insurance required
- Adaptive housing grants to help Veterans with permanent and total service-connected disabilities purchase or build an adapted home, or modify an existing home to accommodate the disability

Pension Benefits

Improved pension is a tax-free, income-based benefit paid to wartime Veterans and un-remarried surviving spouses or unmarried dependent children, who meet certain age or disability requirements and whose income and assets fall within certain limits.

Health Care

VA administers its medical benefits through an annual patient enrollment system. The enrollment system is based on Priority Groups to ensure health care benefits are readily available to all enrolled Veterans. Veterans may qualify for cost-free health care services based on compensable service-connected disabilities.

VA health care includes all necessary inpatient hospital care and outpatient services to promote, preserve or restore health. Veterans Health Administration (VHA) medical facilities provide a wide range of services including traditional hospital-based services such as surgery, critical care, mental health, orthopedics, pharmacy, radiology and physical therapy.

Education and Training

Programs include:

- Post-9/11 GI Bill
- Montgomery GI Bill
- Montgomery GI Bill Select Reserve
- Reserve Educational Assistance Program
- Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E) Program, designed to help Veterans with service-connected disabilities maintain suitable employment, and/or achieve independent daily living.

Burial

VA burial allowances partially reimburse eligible Veterans' burial and funeral costs. A single payment is made for service-related causes of death. For non-service-related deaths, two payments are generally made, one for burial and funeral expenses and one for a plot or interment.

Headstones and markers for unmarked graves of any deceased eligible Veteran in any cemetery are furnished upon request at no charge. If you are interested in a Veterans cemetery burial, you may pre-register at the state or national cemetery of your choice.
