E.S. Rose Park Sports Complex



ESTABLISHED

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Purpose

In 2007, Metro Parks entered into an agreement with Belmont University to construct athletic fields in E.S. Rose Park to be used by the general public and the university's sports teams.

This shared use agreement requires Belmont to make lease payments of \$50K per year (with a 3% annual increase) to Metro Parks. The agreement stipulates that 20% of the lease payment be split equally between the Parent Teacher Organizations (PTOs) of Rose Park and Carter Lawrence Magnet Schools.

The agreement also requires Belmont to bear the cost of utilities related to its use of the facilities and to provide maintenance and repair services during its respective sports' competitive seasons.

An annual monitoring report is prepared for the purpose of detailing:

- overall park usage,
- lease payments by Belmont,
- usage of these payments by Metro Parks, Rose Park and Carter Lawrence Magnet schools,
- utility payments by Metro Parks and Belmont specific to the E.S. Rose Park agreement,
- parking / traffic issues,
- security and crime data,
- and Belmont's community scholarships.

Background/History

Located at Nashville's E.S. Rose Park on the historic Edgehill Civil War battleground area, the E.S. Rose Park athletic fields are a revolutionary shared facilities concept. E.S. Rose Park provides a state-of-the-art, 24-acre community facility which includes baseball, softball and soccer fields, a basketball court, a walking track, and a training facility that meets NCAA Division I standards.

Metro Parks and Recreation owns and controls the scheduling of E.S. Rose Park athletic fields. In addition to athletic offerings, the partnership promotes new and improved collaborations between Metro Parks, Carter Lawrence Elementary School, Rose Park Middle School, local neighborhood organizations, and nearby Belmont University. The park is open to the public from dawn to dusk except when a scheduled event is reserved at the facility.

Lease Payments - Usage of Funds

PTOs from Carter Lawrence & Rose Park Schools

The Carter Lawrence PTO used \$6,523.86 of the designated funds to supplement the purchase of tickets and transportation expenses related to field trips for students whose parents are unable to pay the costs of these field trips.

The Rose Park PTO used \$6,523.86 of the designated funds to purchase a web-based educational platform named "Freckles." This program is available to all Rose Park students. The remainder of the grant was used to support the Teacher Student Association.

Easley Community Center

Easley Community Center has continued to use the Belmont Funds to enhance their youth, adult, and senior programs. Approximately 120 youth, ages 6-14, participate in the center's afterschool and/or summer programs. Both programs are free and offer a variety of activites including: various games, sports, arts and crafts, dancing, and homework help. Children get to interact with the community, learn proper socialization skills, and stay active during the school year.

Metro Parks Senior Recreation Program provides services and activities specifically designed for those who are 55 years of age and older and provide a variety of programs including visual arts, dance, crafts, and other recreational pursuits. Below is a list of additional programs and activities they have been able to provide to patrons of Easley.

*The chart above shows the amounts that Metro Parks and Belmont have each paid to both NES and Metro Water Services during the past year. The agreement states that Belmont shall bear the cost of all utilities consumed in connection with use or maintenance except those utilities consumed during community events. A percentage breakdown is used to determine what percentage of utilities is paid by each party based upon athletic season usage by Belmont and also the general public.

There were no reported parking or traffic issues for the current reporting cycle.

Easley's Facility Manager Marlo Lavender and administrators from the University's Athletic Department communicate on a regular basis to identify and solve potential parking and traffic challenges for heavy usage dates specific to Rose Park.

School administrators from the Rose Park Magnet School are also updated and informed in advance of high traffic events. A proactive approach to resolving issues has proven to be a successful plan of action. Per Marlo Lavender, "With high volume usage comes parking issues. We will continue to work together and communicate for the common good of everyone."

Belmont University Security Plan

The Belmont University Campus Security Department oversees the security needs for school's team practices and games. This includes the assignment and payment of officers.

Belmont and Metro Park Police officers are utilized to monitor practices and games for Belmont University Athletic Department Rose Park field reservations.

The Belmont University Department of Campus Security also conducts periodic patrols at Rose Park when other duties on campus do not take precedence.

Scholarships

Belmont created the E.S. Rose Scholarship in memory of Reverend E.S. Rose, who was pastor of the city's Greater Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church from 1928-1944, and a well-known community activist.

The scholarship program awards two four-year, full-tuition scholarships each academic year. Every other year, one additional four-year, half-tuition scholarship is awarded.

Selection is based upon academic accomplishment, leadership (in school and community) and demonstrated financial need.

Priority consideration is given to students living in closest proximity to the Edgehill neighborhood and who submit and complete an application for admission to the University by December 1 of each year.

Scholarship recipients agree to perform 20 hours of community service each academic year in the E.S. Rose Park and Edgehill neighborhoods.

In FY 19, 10 students received \$282,863.00 in E.S. Rose Scholarship funds.
