
The number of Davidson County residents living in poverty decreased from 129,057 in 2014 to 111,230 in 2015, a statistically significant decrease.

While this is positive news, there are still too many who live with poverty, with disparity in race/ethnicity, age, educational level, disability status and other factors. In Davidson County's total population of 678,889, more than 111,230 remain in poverty. Even worse, 43,068 Nashvillians live in deep poverty (below 50% of poverty).

Charts below compare Davidson County's percentage in poverty, mean/median income and per capita income for the years 2011 through 2015. Economic improvements are reflected throughout this data.




